PRACTICAL POINTS TO NOTE!

Student ID Card

Please collect your Student ID card from reception. You will need this for the cafeteria, bookstore, IT Service Desk, library etc.

Classrooms and Buildings

CR = Cervin

EI = Eiger

GR = Grenier

LF = La Fontaine

MB = Mont Blanc

OL = Olympus

PC = Picasso

SL = Salève

The first digit of the room number indicates on which floor the room can be found, for example: CR-215 is on the second floor (USA) in the Cervin building, EI-320 is on the third floor (USA) of the Eiger building.

Our software only allows us to enter six characters to identify a room. Therefore, where a room ends in the letter "A", we drop the first number and add an "A"; e.g. CR-17A (on your timetable)
= CR-217A and EI-15A = EI-115A etc.

Locker Keys

The locker key office is in the Mont Blanc building and it is open from 13h00 to 13h30 every day. Enter the building (opposite the Panthers Sports Café) and just to the right of the staircase you will see a kiosk window (with lots of keys hanging up).

Athletics Department – CDL Tops

You will need to purchase either a CDL T-shirt or a CDL sweatshirt to wear during your Physical Education classes. Your CDL top needs to be visible when you have your PE classes.

Lunch at CDL

Students who are registered for hot lunch will eat in the Eiger cafeteria (located in the basement of the Eiger building).

Students will need to present their student ID card to receive a lunch ticket.

Students with a picnic lunch can eat in the Grenier (above the Panthers Sports Café), or in the Eiger cafeteria.

Bookstore and IT Service Desk

You can purchase your textbooks and stationery at the bookstore and collect your iPad or MacBook Air from the IT Service Desk. Both services are in the basement of the Mont Blanc building (close to reception).

CDL School Buses

Buses will be in place (in front of and behind the Olympus building) to take students home after school. School will end five minutes early (at 15:45) on the first day to ensure that students find the correct bus before the scheduled departure time at 16:00. As of the second day, the school bus service will be fully operational, collecting students at the appointed place and bringing them to school in time for the first class at 8:20.

At the end of the school day, the first bus service leaves promptly at 16:00 and the second, for those in extra-curricular activities, at 17:30.
