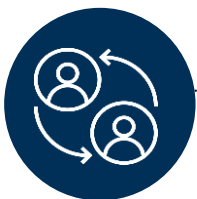
An Educator's Guide To Teaching Students How To Learn

ABOUT THE SESSION

Students often view learning as something that is done to them, rather than something they do. They can focus only about exam success, rather than being a lifelong learners. Teachers can reframe the process of learning by modelling and directly teaching students about the science of learning. This understanding helps to harness a mindset needed for independent learning, motivation and long-term retention. Explore practical techniques that teachers can implement to help students grasp and utilise evidence-based learning strategies. Help students *connect the dots*, so they can be better learners now and in the future.
