

The Year 1 children were super excited to have started a new book in English this week featuring the one and only Percy the Park Keeper.



The children were eager to work together at the beginning of the week to role play and discuss how to rescue the rabbit who was stuck down the well. After exploring more about what being a 'park keeper' actually means, the children learnt a new skill: labelling. First they labelled things around the classroom, including their teachers, and then they labelled a park scene using their phonics mats to help them! After that, the Year 1s learnt all about adjectives playing a fun and interactive game called 'Guess who'. Towards the end of the week the children put all of their park keeper knowledge into sentences, including adjectives, capital letters and full stops - superb!









In our Topic lessons, our new book linked well with our learning about Plants. Percy's badger friend wanted to find out more about flowers and, alongside the children, learnt all about the different parts of a flower and their uses. They went on a flower hunt around the school, used broccoli to make deciduous trees, dissected flowers using scientific tools and made their own fabulous pieces of art work using dry flowers. Don't forget the catchy song: roots, stem, leaves, flower, need sun and air and a little rain shower...

A wonderful week in Year 1 full of hard work, collaboration and creativity!
