### **SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY**

It is school policy that all student in year's 7-11 wear school uniform when attending school or when participating in an event or representing the school.

Our school uniform policy is deliberately broad, taking into consideration the equality, diversity and identity of our students.

When entering Year 12, students will be informed on appropriate upper school uniform, expectations and standards.

School uniform is important because it:

- promotes a sense of pride in the school
- creates a feeling of community and belonging
- is practical and smart
- makes students feel equal to their peers

The uniform is designed to be comfortable, safe and appropriate for use. NAISHK uniform can be purchased from our uniform supplier, Aston Wilson

## **Full School Uniform**

Students should wear full school uniform during non PE/House days.

- School Blazer or NAISHK black hoodie.
- NAISHK Shirt and NAISHK Tie
- NAISHK trousers/Short/Skirts and Skorts
- Black or NAISHK socks
- Plain Black Shoes (no trainers or branded logos)

### **PE and House Uniform**

Students can wear the PE uniform for days when they have PE. Students can wear House tops for House events and competitions.

- NAISHK black hoodie
- NAISHK PE top including NAISHK IGCSE PE top

<sup>\*</sup>skirts should be at knee length

- NAISHK PE shorts
- Plain white socks
- White or predominately white trainers
- NAISHK House top for House events and competitions

### Weather

- Students can come to and leave school by wearing appropriate outdoor wear during bad/cold weather periods
- Students must wear full school uniform/PE uniform during the school day
- Students may wear navy blue or black leggings and/or compression vests underneath their full or PE school uniform. These cannot be branded.

#### Hair

- Clean, neat and tidy
- Colouring of hair is allowed, natural colouring, however it must be discrete
- Extreme hairstyles are not permitted (e.g. mohawks, shaved patterns or writing and/or hair colouring that is extreme)
- Long hair must be tied back and kept off the face during practical based lessons
- For Health and Safety, excess use of wax and gel is not permitted
- Hair ornaments/ decoration should be functional and kept to a minimum

### **Accessories**

- Discrete small necklaces may be worn as small medallions under the shirt
  but may need to be removed for certain lessons as a health and safety requirement.
- We are aware that some jewellery may be for religious reasons and are respectful of this.
- Pierced earings must be small and plain. Earings must be in the conventional position in the earlobe. Multiple earings are not permitted.
- Bracelets/wristbands must be smart and kept to a minimum.

# **Make Up and Nails**

• Makeup should be minimised and discreet



- Nails must be of a suitable length to enable participation in practical activities
- Acrylic/gel based nails are not permitted
