Introduction

Our community has a shared responsibility to provide a safe, secure, caring, and friendly school environment for all its members. This policy outlines the school's dress code policy for students, taking into consideration the cultural values and norms of the United Arab Emirates.

Definition

A school dress code is a set of guidelines defining acceptable attire and appearance standards for students. It outlines expectations regarding clothing, grooming, and personal presentation to promote a conducive learning environment, ensure safety, and reflect the SISD values.

Purpose and Rationale

The primary purpose of implementing a dress code policy is to cultivate a positive learning environment. By setting guidelines for appropriate attire, the policy aims to minimize distractions and disruptions in the classroom, enhancing students' focus and academic performance. Additionally, the policy fosters a sense of equity and inclusivity by removing barriers associated with fashion choices, ensuring that all students feel a sense of belonging within the school community.

The rationale behind the dress code policy encompasses various factors, including preparing students for future professional environments, promoting safety and security, instilling respect and responsibility, and minimizing peer pressure and bullying. By adhering to a dress code, students learn essential skills related to professional attire and standards, which are crucial for their future careers. Additionally, the policy addresses health and safety concerns by implementing regulations on attire that promote safety on school grounds.

- Lost Property: All uniforms, bags, water bottles, and other personal belongings brought to school must be clearly labelled with the child's name and class to facilitate identification and prevent loss. Students are not permitted to use trolley-bags or suitcases on wheels for school purposes, and bags must be of a size that can fit inside lockers provided by the school. Any unclaimed uniform items found in lost property, which are not labelled, will be designated for re-sale or donation after a specified period to ensure efficient use of resources and space.
- Medical documents: Parents are required to email a medical document to the Grade Learning Coordinator and Homeroom teacher in the event there is a medical reason the student is unable to meet the uniform expectations.

Cultural Dress norms in the UAE

In line with UAE cultural norms, SISD encourages modesty and respect for Islamic values in attire. Students should avoid overly revealing clothing and be mindful of offensive imagery or language. While traditional Emirati attire is not mandatory for non-Emirati students, its respectful adoption during cultural events is encouraged. Sensitivity to diverse cultural perspectives and adaptability in attire choices fosters a welcoming and inclusive environment.

Examinations

- During examination periods, students are required to continue to adhere to the school's dress code policy.
- The dress code for examinations is consistent with the standard dress code expectations and applies to all formal assessments, including but not limited to mock and final examinations.

Educational Visits

- During educational visits, students are expected to represent the school in a positive and respectful manner, including through their attire.
- While the specific dress code may vary depending on the nature of the visit, students are generally required to dress appropriately for the occasion, taking into consideration factors such as cultural sensitivities and the nature of the destination.
- Students should adhere to the guidelines provided by the school regarding dress code for educational visits and ensure that their attire is comfortable, practical, and suitable for the activities planned.
- Failure to comply with the dress code for educational visits may result in students being excluded from participating in the trip or facing disciplinary action upon their return.

Lanyards

Lanyard Requirement for G11 & 12 Students

- G11 & 12 students, who have opted for a business dress uniform rather than the standard SISD uniform, are required to wear lanyards at all times in accordance with the SISD Health and Safety and Safeguarding Policy.
- Boarding students are required to wear their boarding specific lanyard.

Procedure for Students Without Lanyards:

- In the event that a student arrives at school without a lanyard, they must sign for and borrow a lanyard from security or the pastoral team.
- Students must deposit their phone in exchange for the borrowed lanyard and will receive their phone back upon returning the lanyard at the end of the day.

Lanyard Provision and Responsibility

- The school will provide each student with a lanyard for their use.
- If a lanyard is lost, the student will be responsible for covering the replacement cost as per the school's policy on lost or damaged items.

Sports

PE and Sports Days

- SISD regulation sports shorts and regulation polo shirts for all grades.
- Sports footwear is mandatory for all PE lessons. Open toe shoes or slides are not permitted.
- All long hair must be tied back during all lessons and competitions.

Sports Team (Match Day)

• Student attend school in normal uniform and change into team kit after school

Swimming Days (KG1-Grade 5)

- School swimming costume (girls) or trunks and tops (boys).
- Goggles, swimming cap, towel and water shoes/flip-flops.

Hair and Accessories for PE

- Long hair must be tied back for safety and hygiene.
- Accessories should be simple, modest, and culturally appropriate.
- Excessive or distracting hair styles, makeup, and jewelry are not permitted.

No hoop style earrings are permitted – <u>Studs only</u>

Footwear

• Closed-toe shoes are mandatory for safety.

Enforcement

 Teachers and staff will monitor compliance. Non-compliance will result in reminders and escalating disciplinary actions as necessary.

Consequences for non-compliance

Students attending school in culturally inappropriate uniform due to length or fitting will be immediately removed from lessons until appropriate uniform is provided by the family. The student will remain out of lessons until appropriate uniform is provided by the family. The school reserves the right to revoke the ability of students to wear selected school uniform items if not worn appropriately.
